Environmental Services will close portions of the Fanno Trail starting next week to replace maintenance access structures in the Garden Home section of the Fanno Pressure Sewer. Parts of the trail will close from June 10 through July 1 and trail users will detour around the closure on neighborhood streets and on the path on SW Garden Home Road (see map with closure locations on back).

The trail closure will allow construction crews to excavate and expose the pressure sewer at SW 82nd and 84th avenues to replace the three maintenance access structures. The structures were damaged when the Fanno Basin Pump Station was activated in November 2012. Environmental Services is installing a surge tank to relieve stress in the pipes and protect the pressure sewer when the pump station is activated in the future. Per its agreement with Clean Water Services, Environmental Services will activate the Fanno Basin Pump Station when work to replace the maintenance structures and installation of the surge tank is complete.

Environmental Services will replace several more maintenance access structures along the pressure sewer before activating the new SW 86th Avenue Pump Station. Pump station construction should begin this August and be complete by early 2016.
