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Eastmoreland-Woodstock Sewer Repair Project

Construction Update

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Construction continues on a project in your neighborhood to repair or replace about 40,000 feet of severely deteriorated sewer pipes that are more than 60 years old. The work will make the sewer system work more effectively and protect water quality, public health and the environment.

Construction should be completed by summer 2015. The project area is bordered by SE Woodstock Boulevard on the north, SE 28th Avenue on the west, SE 45th Avenue on the east and SE Crystal Springs Boulevard on the south. See map on back.

Construction Schedule

Below is the estimated construction schedule for the rest of this week and the next couple of weeks. Construction will move from one site to another as work on each segment is completed. Due to the weather, the schedule was delayed a couple of days.

Week of March 10

- SE Knapp Street (36th to 37th) – Start open trench construction. Open trench construction will take approximately three weeks per block. Streets will be closed to vehicles during work hours, but local pedestrian access will be maintained. If you need your vehicle during work hours, please park on another street before 7am.
- SE Flavel Street (42nd to 45th) – Finish installing new branches to connect houses to main public sewer pipe.
- SE Lambert Street (42nd to 44th) – Prepare street for pipe bursting.
- SE Rex Street (at 42nd) – Continue to pipe burst, connect or install manholes, and install new branches to connect houses to main public sewer pipe.

Week of March 17

- SE Lambert Street (42nd to 44th) – Pipe burst, connect or install manholes, and install new branches to connect houses to main public sewer pipe.
- SE Rex Street (at 42nd) – Continue to connect or install manholes, and install new branches to connect houses to main public sewer pipe.
- SE Knapp Street (36th to 37th) – Continue open trench construction.

What We've Heard From You

- We've received questions about the quality of paving on the streets where work has been completed. This is temporary asphalt patching. The contractor will return in the coming weeks to do permanent paving.
- A neighbor, concerned about the large amount of rain recently, asked what the fabric is around the stormdrain on their street and whether or not it's permanent. The fabric is called a bio-bag and is placed around stormdrains where construction work is occurring as an erosion control measure. The bio-bag prevents material from entering the stormdrain.

What to Expect During Construction

- Typical work hours are 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Monday through Friday, but may work during the same hours on Saturdays.
- Construction will create noise, vibration and dust and will disrupt normal neighborhood activity.
- Traffic control signs will be set up. The contractor will maintain local access, but you should expect delays.
- On-street parking in or near the work area will be prohibited during construction hours. Please plan to move your vehicle each day by 7:00 a.m.
- Equipment and materials may be stored on nearby streets overnight.
- There may be periods of inactivity between construction phases.
- A city inspector will be on-site during work hours and may be able to assist you with construction concerns. Inspectors typically wear a safety vest and hard hat.
- Please stay clear of all construction activities. Please keep your children from harm and instruct them to stay clear of all construction activities. We also appreciate your keeping pets and vehicles out of the construction areas.
