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Eastmoreland-Woodstock Sewer Repair Project

Construction Update

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Construction continues on a project in your neighborhood to repair or replace about 40,000 feet of severely deteriorated sewer pipes that are more than 60 years old. The work will make the sewer system work more effectively and protect water quality, public health and the environment.

Construction should be completed by summer 2015. The project area is bordered by SE Woodstock Boulevard on the north, SE 28th Avenue on the west, SE 45th Avenue on the east and SE Crystal Springs Boulevard on the south. See map on back.

Construction Schedule

Below is the estimated construction schedule for the next couple of weeks. As the contractor completes construction on each street, a temporary asphalt patch is applied. They will return at a later date to apply permanent paving.

Week of May 26 (No Work on Monday, May 26)

- SE Crystal Springs Blvd (SE Cesar E Chavez Blvd towards 41st) – Set up and start pipe burst, connect or install manholes, and install new branches to connect houses to main public sewer pipe.
- SE Knapp Street (Cesar E Chavez Blvd to SE 42nd to SE 36th) – Continue to install new branches to connect houses to main public sewer pipe (except Friday).
- SE Knapp Street (SE 42nd to 37th) – Continue to install storm drains (except Friday).

Week of June 2

- SE Crystal Springs Blvd (SE 40th towards 44th) – Set up and start pipe burst, connect or install manholes, and install new branches to connect houses to main public sewer pipe.
- SE Knapp Street (SE 42nd to 37th) – Continue to install storm drains (except Friday).

What to Expect During Construction

- Typical work hours are 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Monday through Friday, but may work during the same hours on Saturdays.
- Construction will create noise, vibration and dust and will disrupt normal neighborhood activity.
- Traffic control signs will be set up. The contractor will maintain local access, but you should expect delays.
- On-street parking in or near the work area will be prohibited during construction hours. Please plan to move your vehicle each day by 7:00 a.m.
- Equipment and materials may be stored on nearby streets overnight.
- There may be periods of inactivity between construction phases.
- A city inspector will be on-site during work hours and may be able to assist you with construction concerns. Inspectors typically wear a safety vest and hard hat.
- Please stay clear of all construction activities. Please keep your children from harm and instruct them to stay clear of all construction activities. We also appreciate your keeping pets and vehicles out of the construction areas.
