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Eastmoreland-Woodstock Sewer Repair Project

Construction Update

June 23, 2014

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Construction continues on a project in your neighborhood to repair or replace about 40,000 feet of severely deteriorated sewer pipes that are more than 60 years old. The work will make the sewer system work more effectively and protect water quality, public health and the environment.

Developments of Note

- Summer is here and the kids are playing outside. Construction crews are very aware of this while driving equipment in your neighborhood. As you know, equipment and supplies throughout the area could be hazardous for those riding bicycles or skateboarding. Safety is our number one priority and we appreciate your help in keeping pets and kids out of the work zone.
- Illegal dumping of garbage and unwanted household items has recently become an issue in the work zone. This can cause unnecessary delays in the project, as well as increased costs to take these items to the landfill.

Construction Schedule

Below is the estimated construction schedule for the next few weeks. Please be aware that this schedule is subject to change due to a variety of factors, including underground conditions, weather, subcontractor schedules and availability of materials. As the contractor completes construction on each street, work crews apply a temporary asphalt patch. They will return at a later date to apply permanent paving.

Week of June 23

- SE Malden Street (east and west of SE 42nd) – Continue open trench construction (no Fridays).
- SE Carlton Street (between SE 29th and 30th) – Set up and start pipe burst, connect or install manholes, and install new branches to connect houses to main public sewer pipe.
- SE 30th Avenue (between SE Tolman and Carlton) – Set up to pipe burst, connect or install manholes, and install new branches to connect houses to main public sewer pipe.

Week of June 30 (No work on July 4)

- SE Malden Street (east and west of SE 42nd) – Continue open trench construction (no Fridays).
- SE 30th Avenue (between SE Tolman and Carlton) – Pipe burst, connect or install manholes, and install new branches to connect houses to main public sewer pipe.

Week of July 7

- SE Malden Street (east and west of SE 42nd) – Continue open trench construction (no Fridays).
- SE Martins Street (west of SE 32nd Avenue) – Pipe burst, connect or install manholes, and install new branches to connect houses to main public sewer pipe.

Construction should be completed by summer 2015. The project area is bordered by SE Woodstock Boulevard on the north, SE 28th Avenue on the west, SE 45th Avenue on the east and SE Crystal Springs Boulevard on the south. See map on back.
