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Eastmoreland-Woodstock Sewer Repair Project

Construction Update

August 1, 2014

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Construction continues on a project in your neighborhood to repair or replace about 40,000 feet of severely deteriorated sewer pipes that are more than 60 years old. The work will make the sewer system work more effectively and protect water quality, public health and the environment.

Developments of Note

- In the coming weeks, crews will be permanently paving the patched areas of SE Malden Street, SE 29th, SE Carlton, and SE 30th Avenue. Timing depends on the weather and crew availability.

Construction Schedule

Below is the estimated construction schedule for the next few weeks. Please be aware that this schedule is subject to change due to a variety of factors, including underground conditions, weather, subcontractor schedules and availability of materials. As the contractor completes construction on each street, work crews apply a temporary asphalt patch. They will return at a later date to apply permanent paving.

Week of August 4

- SE 29th Avenue (north and south of SE Tolman) – Connect or install manholes, and install new branches to connect houses to main public sewer pipe.
- SE 29th Avenue (north of SE Bybee Boulevard) – Pipe burst, connect or install manholes, and install new branches to connect houses to main public sewer pipe.
- SE Martins Street (west of SE 32nd) – Continue open trench construction (no Fridays).
- SE 28th Avenue (between SE Bybee Boulevard and SE Tolman) – Start temporary sewer branch connections in preparation for pipe bursting.

Week of August 11

- SE 28th Avenue (between SE Bybee Boulevard and SE Tolman) – Pipe burst, connect or install manholes, and install new branches to connect houses to main public sewer pipe.
- SE Martins Street (west of SE 32nd) – Continue open trench construction (no Fridays).
- SE Henry Street (east of SE 34th Avenue) - Start temporary sewer branch connections and preparation for pipe bursting.

Construction should be completed by summer 2015. The project area is bordered by SE Woodstock Boulevard on the north, SE 28th Avenue on the west, SE 45th Avenue on the east and SE Crystal Springs Boulevard on the south. See map on back.
