## SW 86th Avenue Pump Station Construction Update

Environmental Services will complete construction of the SW 86th Avenue Pump Station by the end of 2015. The new pump station will increase capacity in the Fanno Basin Sewer System, ensure that the system can handle all wastewater flows during large rain storms, and protect public health and the health of the Fanno Creek Watershed.

### What We've Heard from You

- We've been asked why construction workers park their personal vehicles in the neighborhood. Many different crews with different specialties are working on the project right now and on-site space is limited. The contractor has restricted worker parking along SW 86th Avenue and has instructed workers not to park at the end of SW 84th Avenue. Workers are permitted to park personal vehicles on public streets and they will be courteous to neighbors.
- Why the white circles? The white circles painted on SW 77th and along the trail mark locations of structures that allow maintenance access to the pressure sewer. The marks are part of the design of a project to replace the structures. Work on that project will begin in late 2015 or early 2016.

### Developments of Note

- In a few months, the contractor will remove two alder trees next to the Fanno Creek Trail on the north side of the project site (east of the bridge), and a smaller evergreen on the east side of the project site next to the trail. The trees interfere with construction and are a safety risk for the public and construction workers. The Tualatin Hills Park and Recreation District has approved the tree removal.
- On the east side of the project site close to the fence, crews are installing pipes that will connect to the existing pressure sewer line under the trail at SW 84th. The contractor will have to close the trail to connect the lines. You will receive advance notification of the trail closure.
- Work will begin as soon as May on the manhole next to the Fanno Creek Trail across the creek from the Fanno Basin Pump Station. This work may also cause intermittent trail closures. When work is finished, the contractor will remove the two plastic



dome structures and install an opaque screen. Environmental Services is working with the Tualatin Hills Park and Recreation District on screen design.

- The SW 86th Avenue Pump Station is on schedule to be completed this winter.
