

Motorcycle Mechanic

General Summary

Positions in this broad class perform mechanical repair, maintenance, and modification of Police Bureau motorcycles and other vehicles.

Motorcycle Mechanic - 30000129

Distinguishing Characteristics

This is a single level class. It is distinguished from the Vehicle Mechanic class by its primary focus on repairing and servicing Police Bureau motorcycles.

Typical Duties/Examples of Work

1. Performs regular maintenance and inspection of motorcycles.
2. Troubleshoots and repairs mechanical problems as they arise to return motorcycles to service.
3. Performs minor service as needed, such as adjusting and lubricating chains, and checking and adjusting clutches.
4. Sets up new motorcycles and updates current motorcycles to latest specifications.
5. Performs emergency road repair as needed.
6. Assists with service of other types of vehicles and additional shop duties.
7. Performs related duties as assigned.

Required Knowledge, Skills and Abilities

Knowledge of: troubleshooting techniques; mechanical, electrical, and structural systems of motorcycles, vehicles and related equipment

Ability to: maintain records; maintain inventory; research equipment, parts and supplies needs and place orders; communicate effectively; establish priorities and work independently; establish and maintain effective working relationships with co-workers, supervisors and others; work constructively in a team

Skill in: troubleshooting, diagnosis and repair of mechanical, electrical, and structural systems of motorcycles, vehicles and related equipment; evaluate and resolve operating problems experienced by police officers

Special Requirements

Valid driver's license with motorcycle endorsement; required to supply own shop tools

Working Conditions

Work in this class is typically performed in a shop environment; some work is performed in a field environment.
