

Community Use of Public Schools – Portland Public Schools

SUN Community Schools*

For the 2012-13 school year, there are 35 SUN Community Schools in PPS (33 summer programs) offering a wide array of supports for youth and adults in 3 main domains:

- Academics and skill development
- Health, mental health and social services
- Recreation and enrichment

SUN programs utilize a variety of school spaces including gyms, classrooms, cafeteriums, and outdoor play areas. Other SUN Service System services such as Parent-Child Development play groups, youth case management and anti-poverty services are delivered through the SUN Community School sites.

Physical & Mental Health Services

Multnomah County provides health services through School-Based Health Centers located in six high schools and four K-8 schools. School-Based Mental Health consultants are co-located in the School-Based Health Centers.

Before- and After-School Programs

Before-school and after-school care is available for students and neighborhood children at numerous PPS schools through contracts with a variety of public and private daycare providers.

Career Technical Education Partnerships

Selected high schools offer opportunities for career education through partnerships in which students either take coursework off campus (e.g., Jefferson students taking classes at PCC Cascade), or take classes on the high school campus which are taught by a partner organization. (In 2007, 8 PPS high schools offered this opportunity; updated data is pending.)

** SUN Community Schools are full-service neighborhood hubs where school and community partners provide supports to ensure academic success, family self-sufficiency and economic prosperity. SUN Community Schools mobilize and strategically organize community resources to provide:*

- *Strong core instructional program*
- *Educational support and skill development for youth and adults*
- *Enrichment and recreation activities*
- *Family involvement and support*
- *Social, health and mental health resources*
- *Family and community events*

Community Schools are open to all ages, preschool to seniors, with a focus on students in the immediate school community.

SUN Community Schools are the school-based delivery sites for the SUN Service System, a broader system of care and support for children and their families.

Community Use of Public Schools - David Douglas and Parkrose School Districts

David Douglas School District

SUN Community Schools*	For the 2012-13 school year, SUN Community Schools are located in 5 David Douglas elementary schools, 3 middle schools, 1 high school, and 1 alternative school offering educational, enrichment, recreational, social and health services.
Physical & Mental Health Services	Multnomah County provides a School-Based Health Center with Mental Health consultant at David Douglas High School.
Preschool & Daycare	Double D Preschool is run by the district. The district also provides a childcare program for teen parents and community members.
Other	English Language Learning (ELL) classes for parents are offered at various schools.

Parkrose School District

SUN Community Schools*	For the 2012-13 school year, SUN Community Schools are located at 2 Parkrose elementary schools and 1 high school, offering classes for community youth and adults including recreation, English language for ESL adults, Spanish language for English speakers, first aid, CPR, parenting, Zumba, etc. Programs also offer referrals for social service supports (anti-poverty, housing assistance).
Physical & Mental Health Services	Multnomah County provides a School-Based Health Center with Mental Health consultant at Parkrose High School. Multnomah County provides health care, including behavioral health, through the School-Based Health Center for community members covered by the Oregon Health Plan or who are uninsured.
Other	Shaver Elementary has an emergency food pantry through a partnership with Oregon Food Bank, the SUN Service System and Shaver School.
