


Get to know the 2035 Comprehensive Plan

Portland's Comprehensive Plan is a guide for the future of our community as the city grows and changes. Specifically, it affects where new buildings, streets, businesses and houses will go over the next 25 years.

The plan is guided by a vision of an equitable and resilient city, where people and the environment are healthy and businesses can succeed. A city where everyone has access to opportunities and can help shape public decisions that will affect them, their families and friends.

It includes directions that will help the city and community to:


1. Create convenient neighborhoods where people can get to the places, things and services they need.
2. Make it easier to find jobs.
3. Reduce carbon pollution.
4. Improve natural areas and parks.
5. Maintain and improve public infrastructure, like streets, sidewalks and parks.
6. Prepare for climate change, earthquakes and other natural hazards.
7. Plan and design streets and places to fit local conditions.

- How many homes and how many jobs can be created in Portland.

- How community members will be involved in future land use plans and decisions.
- How City bureaus and state and regional agencies work together.


Why now?
