INTRODUCTION

The attached tables present Current Appropriation Level (CAL) target budgets for Fiscal Year 2015-16. As identified in the City's budget guidance, Council has chosen to go with a "stabilization" budget for FY 2015-16 that allows for bureaus to fully fund their current CAL target and, depending on the amount of additional available resources, provides room for some limited add packages. As a result, unlike in most prior years, there are no cut tables or modified zero-based budget tables in this document. Included in these figures are decisions made in the Fall Budget Monitoring Process, including adjustments made as a result of changes made in the Enterprise Business System cost metrics, and the establishment of the intention to debt finance the repair and construction of the City's fuel stations.

The targets are based on a calculation beginning with the FY 2014-15 General Fund Adopted Budget. A variety of inflation factors are applied and adjustments are made for Council decisions and for Citywide budgetary impacts, such as the Public Employee Retirement System (PERS) employer rate changes. For General Fund bureaus, the inflation factor is a weighted average of 0.5% growth in personal services and forecasted inflation for both internal and external materials and services. Additionally, funds associated with cost-of-living adjustments and health benefit increases are included in a separate compensation setaside target.

Table 1 shows the breakdown between General Fund discretionary and overhead funding by bureau. Table 2 summarizes the targets for various transfers to bureaus and other funds. Table 3 lists targets for the divisions of the Office of Management and Finance and special appropriations, while Table 4 lists the remaining discretionary targets (e.g., funds for pension obligation bond debt, contingency, etc.). Table 5 gives a broad summary calculation of how the bureau targets were calculated. Bureaus should use the contact information below or speak to their assigned City Budget Office analyst if they would like more detailed information regarding these calculations.
