Welcome and Introductions

- Chair Donita Fry called the meeting to order at 4:41 p.m. and all committee members introduced themselves.

Work plan Updates

- **Confirm meeting locations**
 - Donita Fry announced a scheduling conflict for the next meeting at New Colombia Villa but stressed the importance of meeting there in the future. Damon Isiah Turner said the conflict was due to another meeting scheduled at the same time with the neighborhood police and ONI.
 - Jeff Selby confirmed The Kelly Building location for the next meeting.
 - Meetings at NAYA in November and Miracles Club in February have been confirmed.
- **New work to the CPRC**
 - Donita Fry asked if it was time to move some of the work out into the community. Patricia agreed and said that it was time to reach into the community and have conversations about the deliverables. Patricia Ford, María Lisa Johnson, and possibly Deanna Wesson-Mitchell will partner to do the outreach.

- **CPRC brochures**
 - The current brochures have been distributed. Donita Fry thanked Jeff Selby and Commander Crebs for their work.
- **Summer community activities**
 - Patricia Ford requested CPRC presence at the Community Fest on July 28, 2013.
 - Donita Fry said she would provide the table.
 - Commander Crebs, María Lisa Johnson, Allan Lazo, Damon Isiah Turner, Emma Covelli and Donita Fry said they would be there to represent the CPRC, Sgt. Anthony Passadore was confirmed as a maybe.
 - Patricia Ford will coordinate the times and Jeff Selby offered to help with communications.

Presentation on traffic stops data-Emma Covelli and Sgt. Greg Stewart from Portland Police Bureau

- Emma and Sgt. Stewart presented a data analysis of 2011 traffic stops (date range: from August 5-December 21, 2011). The reason for the partial year results was that the data sets changed midyear in 2011. The purpose of the analysis was to identify if and when racial profiling occurs and where the disparities are coming from.
- A draft of the report will be sent to the CPRC for review and then released to the public. Chair Donita Fry will determine the timeline for releasing the full report. Donita was hopeful that Emma and Sgt. Stewart might return to discuss the full report in the August 21st CPRC meeting.

Public comment

- Dan Handelman from Copwatch had comments regarding the presentation. He said both the Copwatch and police data show things are getting worse. He suggested they release the data year by year so the public does not need to wait until 2014 for the next analysis. He suggested they define gang crime more clearly. He then commented on the OIR report presented to council and mentioned that disparities do not only occur in traffic stops. He also suggested that instead of handouts, perhaps the CPRC could use easels.

- Irene Konev handed out the OIR report presented to Council today (July 17, 2013).
