DESCRIPTION OF AGENDA

As part of the ONI BAC equitable funding formula initiative Scotty Ellis, Equity Program Manager with Coalition for a Livable Future, will provide an overview of the Equity Atlas project, a summary of key maps and findings, discussion regarding who is utilizing the Equity Atlas, and a live Equity Atlas 2.0 demo. Attendees will leave the presentation with a basic understanding of the capabilities of the Regional Equity Atlas online mapping tool, awareness of who is utilizing the tool, a better sense of regional trends,

office of neighborhood involvement and an understanding of how the tool can support the ONI BAC's needs in developing an equitable funding formula for our community engagement programs.

In addition, we will also initiate discussion about planning for a neighborhood/community summit next fiscal year recognizing we are celebrating the 40th anniversary of ONI. This is a project that ONI partners have been asking for since the last citywide neighborhood summit ONI organized in 2004. ONI asked for a special \$10,000 allocation in our Spring BMP request which Council considers on May 7th. The goal at the meeting would be to organize a planning committee to get this project started.
