Introduced by Commissioner Koch

*Transferring \$6,640 within the General Fund, Bureau of Police, transferring \$6,640 to the Fleet Operating Fund, and increasing resources and requirements of the Fleet Operating Fund, and declaring an emergency.

Discussion: Commissioner Koch explained that the transfer was intended for obtaining a new sedan for the Chief of Police. However, he stated that the City could save money by providing the Chief with an existing Chrysler New Yorker.

Commissioner Bogle said the New Yorker is not appropriate.

Failed because of emergency clause.

Disposition: Failed to pass (Y-3, N-1 Koch).

Introduced by Commissioner Bogle

Repealing the present Chapter 3.96, Office of Neighborhood Associations, and substituting a new chapter relating to neighborhood associations.

Discussion: Commissioner Bogle explained the Office of Neighborhood Associations (ONA) rules underwent a citizen review to clarify guidelines for newly annexed neighborhoods.

Moshe Lenske, Chair of ONA Policies and Procedures Review Committee, urged adoption because the revision is a consensus document which will increase citizen participation in local government.

The following citizens also spoke in support of the ordinance, resolution, and guidelines.

Drew Davis, Lake Oswego resident, proposed to amend the guidelines by deleting the words "sexual orientation" if the voters approved a referendum to delete the same phrase from the City's personnel ordinance.

Lee Pearlman, 512 NE Brazee, urged passage of the guidelines without restriction.

Ivars Bitans, 110 NW King Ave, #3, opposed including the words "sexual orientation". Mr. Bitans was twice ruled out of order because of objectionable language, and was then escorted from the chambers by the Sergeant at Arms.

Shirley Barnard, resident of Madison North Neighborhood, also objected to "sexual orientation".

Sandra Nelson, former southeast Portland resident, spoke in favor of Drew Davis's amendment.

Mike Lowry, 16320 SE Market, objected to allowing homosexuals to serve in ONA leadership.

All Council members expressed support for the guidelines as written.

Disposition: Passed to second reading July 29, 1987.
