A 10-year plan to end homelessness in Portland and Multnomah County

NEW DATA SUPPORTS PLAN'S SUCCESS!

Based on reported data, we estimate that there has been a 12-20% reduction of chronically homeless people on the street between January 2005 and January 2006.

Recently released research from Herbert & Louis concludes that the Central City Concern, Community Engagement Program saves 38.7% (or \$16,299 per person) in resources for chronically homeless people.
