



## UASI 2011 Reprogramming Approved Projects July 2013

Below is a summary of projects totaling \$653,100, which were approved by both the RDPO Program and Steering Committees during the July 2013 UASI FY2011 Reprogramming. Funds for this current round of FY2011 grant sub-awards in the Portland Metropolitan Region (also known as the Portland Urban Area) were made available through costs savings from completed projects, unspent funds from projects that were unable to be implemented/completed, and some contingency funds that were released. The original FY2011 grant award to the region was more than \$4.9 million and has been invested in a range of strategic preparedness areas, such as collaborative regional planning; interoperable communications; regional incident response equipment; restoration of lifelines; regional exercising; training of key tactical teams; and community and citizen preparedness.

The RDPO Grants and Finance Committee (the GFC) helped administer the reprogramming process together with the Portland Bureau of Emergency Management's Finance and Grants Team and the RDPO Administrator. RDPO Work Groups and Sub-Committees were required to align their project applications with the following guidance:

- Regional projects would be given priority over jurisdiction-or agency-specific requests
- Proposals completing or supplementing existing projects and capabilities would be given priority over new projects and capabilities.
- All projects should be able to be sustained/maintained after grant funds expire
- No radio cache projects will be funded
- No Professional, Technical, Expertise (PTE) contracts
- No new projects that require a Federal Environmental and Historic Preservation (EHP) approval
- All projects must align with UASI PUA FY 2011 Investment Justifications.
- All projects are required to be completed by December 31, 2013.

WG	Project	Approved Funding	Comments
Animal MAC-G	Large Animal Trailers and Equipment	\$13,000	<p>This project was originally designed to purchase four animal/stock trailers and related accessories/equipment for transporting livestock and/or other animals in the event of an emergency.</p> <p>During Program Committee negotiations on FY10 Phase II Reprogramming project proposals, the Proposer agreed to scale down the Project from four to two trailers (et al) , with the idea that funding for the remaining two trailers will be sought at a later date. Both the Program and Steering Committees approved FY2010 Reprogramming Phase II funding for two trailers (one based in Washington County, the other in Clackamas County).</p> <p>During this round of FY11 Reprogramming, the project was resubmitted during the PrC meeting on July 15, with a request to fund just one more trailer (for Clark County). The Proposer explained that the fourth trailer was no</p>

			longer needed.
Citizen Corps	CERT Burn Pan	\$2,250	This project would provide funding for an additional burn pan to be used by CERT volunteers when learning how to use a fire extinguisher. Currently, all of the 5 CERT teams in Columbia County borrow one burn pan when they do training. Not only is one burn pan insufficient for a training class, but it also is very difficult to coordinate as it is shared between 5 cities. An additional burn pan would aid in training more CERT volunteers more efficiently.
Fire/EMS	Structural Collapse Training (SCT)/Multi-Discipline Operational Awareness	\$85,000	This project will provide 80 hour core training to 30 additional personnel to increase available USAR personnel resources throughout the region. The project is also actively seeking members from the Public Works WG to jointly participate in 20 hours of the training that is applicable to their discipline. Within the 20 hours is a 10 hour joint simulation culminating at the end of the fire SCT training that both disciplines will work through together.
Fire/EMS	Lifepak 15s	\$50,000	This project is a request for additional funds to support regional capacity for Medical Care Point capabilities as previously funded by UA10-0056, which funded Lifepak 15 defibrillators.  Project scaled down from three units in the original request to two by Fire/EMS WG Chair with the idea that funding for the remainder will be sought at a later date.
LE	MEDU/Security Magazine Upgrades	\$90,800	This is an amendment to an existing project. This funding is for the completion of the originally approved grant project:  Extend the power source from the mainline (owned by Pacific Power, located off of Elrod Rd), install a pole, run the cable across the grounds ending at the magazine site and then install a security system, lighting and cameras for the MEDU magazine.
LE	Waterborne Climbing Gear	\$53,000	This project funds Tactical Operations Climbing Equipment for Maritime Operations.
LE	Waterborne Backpacks	\$24,000	This project funds Waterborne Tactical Operations Backpacks for Maritime Operations.
LE	Waterborne Tactical Ladder	\$39,570	This project funds REBS Tactical Ladders for Maritime Operations.
MCA	BNVD + Helmet Attachments	\$16,000	This project funds Binocular Night Vision Devices (BNVD) and helmet mounts for regional use. The devices will increase the regional marine units' ability to identify threats and increase response in low light conditions. Project scaled down by representative to meeting.
MCA	GIS Based Aerial Photo River Atlas	\$7,500	This project funds GIS Based Aerial Photo River Atlases. The Atlas provides emergency responders with an up to date, photographic representation of the river front geography detailing every addressable structure, residence and boat slip. This provides a photographic representation for each location in a manner that other maps or the address numbering grid alone cannot provide. Each atlas is printed on weather resistant paper to ensure durability and prolong useable life.
PW	Incident Response Trucks	\$150,000	This project funds two Incident Response Trucks for the Cities of Beaverton and Hillsboro.

PW	Portable Light Plants	\$72,000	This project funds four (4) Portable Light Plants, one each for Clackamas River Water Authority, City of Milwaukie, City of Wood Village and City of Clatskanie..
PW	Trailer Mounted Variable Message Signs	\$40,000	This project funds two Trailer Mounted Variable Message Signs, one each for City of Hillsboro and City of Oregon City.
RMC	Resource Request Board Enhancements	\$10,000	<p>This project will fund implementation of several improvements to the WebEOC Resource Request Board. The Resource Request Board is an online system that automates the requesting, assigning, ordering, and tracking of resources in emergencies. It can be used in county EOCs. It is currently installed on all three instances of WebEOC (Portland and Clackamas and Clark counties) and by the Regional Logistics Support Team. The county and City of Portland emergency management agencies are currently assessing their ability to integrate the board into their resource management processes. They have the option to use as-is, customize the board to meet any specific needs (outside of this project), or share data ('data link') to this board.
