

## The RDPO “Ten Index” – Spring 2016

**\$2,659,192**

**Total dollar value of projects the Steering Committee approved in March 2016 as part of the UASI FY16 grant application process.** Two of the 14 projects, including an emergency mobile water treatment plant for the City of Gresham, received \$164,000 in funding from the RDPO’s projects fund (donated by contributing members). **\$500,000**

**Largest award under UASI FY16 to a single project: the Regional Information Sharing Project.** The project (funded in part under UASI FY2015 @ \$500,000 of estimated \$2.0 million budget) will upgrade the Enterprise Service Bus regional information sharing system used by Public Service Answering Points/911 Centers throughout the RDPO region, which is at its end of life/support. **\$2,459,060**

**Total dollar value of the 23 projects funded under UASI FY15.** Many projects are just getting underway. Go to <http://www.portlandoregon.gov/rdpo/article/530530> to learn more about these projects. [Note: the cover page says “2014” but it is “2015” – FEMA forgot to update the template.]

**\$863,097**

**Value of the UASI FY14 grant that will close on July 31, 2016.** A final report on the results of the 10 projects funded under this grant is under development and will be circulated around the RDPO community by June 2016.

**30,000**

**Total number of gallons of water that one of the emergency mobile water treatment systems can process per day (or serve 30,000 people @ 1 gallon per person per day).** By the time the UASI FY16 grant is implemented, we will have **six** UASI-funded systems in the region. Regional Water Providers Consortium partners have purchased several others.

**66**

**The number of budget lines in the UASI FY15-funded Regional Citizen Corps Program Support Project.** The \$190K project will increase the capacity of regional Citizen Corps partners from counties and cities to recruit, train, and manage volunteers in Community Emergency Response/Neighborhood Emergency Teams, Volunteers in Police Service, Medical Reserve Corps and Amateur Radio Emergency Services. In addition, Multnomah County and Washington County will use some of the funds to promote disaster preparedness in Spanish-speaking communities by establishing a “Listos” program. - 20** **The number of Long-Term Care (LTC) facilities that participated in a recent RDPO project to identify LTC preparedness needs and provide them with tools.** Some hurdles, such as lack of cooperation from out-of-state corporate headquarters, prevented the project from engaging more LTCs. A needs assessment was conducted and several preparedness tools were shared with the 20 participants. Next steps are under consideration.
- 19** **Number of vision/outcome statements the Steering Committee has drafted for the RDPO 2017-2021 Strategic Plan.** The RDPO Steering Committee and RDPO Manager are currently seeking feedback from all levels of the RDPO. The strategic plan and a first year work plan will be ready for the Policy Committee's approval this fall.
- 12** **The average number of months it takes from when the application is submitted to DHS/FEMA HQ and the start of implementation under the UASI Grant Program.** Thanks for your patience!
- 1** **The minimum number of rolls of tall kitchen trash bags that the RDPO's Disaster Sanitation Task Force recently decided should be included in home preparedness kits.** The concept is that during the first 30 days post-earthquake, urbanites using the twin bucket system should line their #2 bucket with a plastic bag for eventual disposal in landfills through a municipal collection system. A more environmentally sound emergency sanitation strategy would commence around Day 31, which is still under development.
