



Heritage Trees of Portland

SHELLBARK HICKORY (*Carya laciniosa*) JUGLANDACEAE

- Native to eastern North America.
- Height can exceed 140' but usually is under 100'.
- Leaves are compound with 7-9 large leaflets. Leaves can be 2' long.
- Nuts ripen in Portland and are tasty but hard to crack. Tree has male and female catkins.
- Bark is ragged but not as shaggy as Shagbark hickory.
- Rare in Portland. These Heritage Trees are behind the house, but tops can be seen from street.
