



Heritage Trees of Portland

SPANISH CHESTNUT (*Castanea sativa*) FAGACEAE

- Native to southern Europe, western Asia, northern Africa.
- Height can reach 120'.
- Leaves are coarsely toothed and glossy, heart-shaped at base.
- Nut husks covered with penetrating prickly spines. The 1-3 nuts are delicious when roasted and peeled. Long male catkins in July and small female flowers.
- Fall color yellow.
- Susceptible to fungus blight but perhaps not so much as American chestnut.
- Somewhat common in Portland.
