



Heritage Trees of Portland

EUROPEAN BEECH (*Fagus sylvatica*) FAGACEAE

- Native to Europe.
- Can reach over 100' in height and spread.
- Leaves vary in color: species is green, cultivars can be purplish, coppery. Shape can be with wavy margins or deeply cut-leaf.
- Flowers inconspicuous; nuts small but edible.
- Fall color is unexceptional.
- Common in Portland, especially copper and purple varieties.
- #54 planted 1890s; #16 in 1892. #155 was planted about 1916 at the John Linden Bowman home.
