



Heritage Trees of Portland

BUTTERNUT (*Juglans cinerea*) JUGLANDACEAE

- Native to eastern North America.
- Can exceed 100' (Portland lost one in 1984 of 102').
- Leaves are compound with 11-17 leaflets; bright olive green and slightly fuzzy, sticky.
- Nuts have sweet flavor and are somewhat easy to crack.
- Tree trunk is usually short with gray bark.
- Fall color often golden yellow.
- Very rare in Portland.
