



Heritage Trees of Portland

BLACK OAK (*Quercus velutina*) FAGACEAE

- Native to central and eastern U.S.
- Height can exceed 100'.
- Leaves 5-9" long, 5-7 pointy lobes; shiny dark green above, yellow-green and often downy beneath.
- Acorns longitudinally striated, 1/2-3/4", cup covers half.
- Bark furrowed, inner bark yellow-orange.
- Fall color dull red or orangey-brown.
- Very rare in Portland.
