



Private For-Hire Transportation Driver Applicant Qualifications

General, Criminal and Driving History: Disqualifying Factors

If the record is positive for ANY the following, further review and information is required. For any factor below, approval may be denied. We will consider evidence of mitigating factors, distance in time, educational or therapeutic programs completed, likelihood of recurrence, and references. For some factors (felony crime against a person, for example), approval is not likely.

General:

1. Less than 21 years of age; or
2. Less than 2 years **continuous** driving experience within the United States; or
3. Inability to obtain car insurance.

Regardless of when it occurred:

1. Felony conviction involving physical harm or **attempted** physical harm to a person;

Within the past 10 years:

1. Felony conviction of any type; or
2. Any suspension or revocation of driver's license that is driving-related, in any jurisdiction;

Within the past 5 years:

1. Conviction for any criminal offense involving theft, robbery, burglary, assault, sex crimes, drugs, prostitution, weapons; or

Within the past 5 years (continued):

2. Conviction for **any** traffic crime (may include, but not limited to: driving under the influence, reckless driving, attempt to elude a police officer, leaving the scene of an accident); OR
3. Greater than 10 traffic infractions; OR
4. Greater than 5 serious traffic infractions; OR
5. Greater than 5 motor vehicle accidents; OR
6. Any combination of serious traffic infractions and accidents (for example, 2 accidents and 3 moving violations, etc.).

Within the past 12 months:

1. More than two traffic infractions of ANY kind; or
2. More than four infractions of ANY kind.

Out of state driver's license holders need to provide a copy of their driving record.

Any applicant who has not been a resident of Oregon for the past 10 years must submit a copy of their out of state driving record for the years they were not a resident of Oregon.
