New Reservoirs to Meet Water Storage Needs

The city's three uncovered reservoirs at Mount Tabor Park must be removed from service by December 2015. To continue to meet the water storage needs for the east side of Portland, construction of a new underground reservoir at Powell Butte Nature Park in southeast Portland is well underway. The 50-million-gallon seismically reinforced facility is slated for completion before the end of this year. The park remains open to visitors during construction.

Also under construction in southeast
Portland is a 25-million-gallon buried
reservoir at Kelly Butte. The facility is scheduled for completion in 2015.

At Washington Park, one open reservoir will be decommissioned and the other renovated into a 15-million-gallon underground tank with a reflecting pool on top. This project will be completed by 2020.
