Public Space Governing

- A review of the [Portland Police Bureau's \(PPB\) second comment period for the directive governing the management of public space](#) - formerly known as "[Established Campsites on Public Spaces](#)"
- Plan is to gather comments from people who are directly impacted by the governing of public spaces (e.g. houseless community).
- The goal is to gather an inform perspectives from the communities being most affected.
- Collaborate with the PCCEP Subcommittee for People with Mental Illness to help reach the houseless community and / or community that are affected by the clearance of campus sites.
- There is a concern and issue with how personal belongings are being handle when the clearance of campus are conducted by the City of Portland.
- Develop a plan on how to communicate the PPB directive on behalf of PCCEP.
- Develop a Recommendation.
- Deadline to submit comments on this PPB directive (clearance of campus) is December 1st, 2019.
