Welcome /New Member	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Committee member Andrew welcomes the community to the PCCEP March General Body meeting and acknowledges Black History Month.• Portland Police Bureau (PPB) – Professional Standards Division provides a brief background on the Fesser Incident. The Independent Police Review (IPR) has an open investigation and PPB is providing the documents needed for IPR to conduct their investigation.• PCCEP staff will begin to track community outreach and engagement between members and local organizations.• A 30 seconds of moment of Silence is given to those who have passed on in the last month.• New member introductions for two open seats:<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Andre La Roche - Describes himself as a good listener who is empathetic to the needs and concerns of others. He received his JD from Stanford Law School and his BA from the University of Washington.○ Albert (Albie) Lemos - Mr. Lemos has provided direct services to individuals with severe and persistent mental illness (SPMI). During his time providing services with mental illness, he has witnessed first-hand the significant barriers faced by these community members. As a Native person working in a Native organization, Mr. Lemos brings unique insight everywhere he goes.○ Ann Campbell - Ann began her career with the Oregon City School District where she worked for 5 years. In Ann’s work she developed and managed education classes and programs for communities.• PCCEP recommends Andre to be appointed by the Mayor to the Committee. The Mayor will need to appoint the second candidate given it was a tie between Ann and Albie.
Subcommittee Reports / PPB Updates	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Steering:<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Discussed the PCCEP winter retreat that was held on January 22nd. Discussed the crafting of a joint statement on behalf of the full board for the Tuesday, February 25th Court Hearing. The Statement focuses only on the Community Engagement and Creation of PCCEP (Section IX).



	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Youth: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Welcomed a new youth member to the subcommittee Taji. The youth survey was submitted to the Intuitional Review Broad (IRB) for Portland Public Schools (PPS) high schools. Feedback was given from PPS and changes to the survey will be made. Hope is to implement the survey in schools this school year 2019-2020. Next steps are to discuss what the subcommittee wants to do with the data (e.g. host a townhall to bring students/ community members to discuss components of the survey to craft recommendations). Continued efforts are being made to help distribute the youth survey at MacLaren. • Racial Equity: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Held a debrief of the Procedural Justice Recommendation that was approved at the PCCEP January 28th Public Meeting. Discussed a six-month plan for the subcommittee (e.g. develop a strategic plan and craft a one pager). Plans to meet with PPB – 5-year Racial Equity Plan team. Hope is to co-host a public meeting with the Subcommittee for People with Mental Illness. • Settlement Agreement and Policy: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Hosted the Compliance Officer and Community Liaison (COCL) presentation on the DRAFT Compliance and Outcome Assessment Quarterly Report: 2019 Updates and Quarter 4 Analysis. The Compliance and Outcome Assessment Report covered three areas of the Settlement Agreement; training, officer accountability, and community engagement. Reviewed and discussed PPB’s “Door Drop” campaign. Suggestions and comments will be sent to PPB regarding the campaign. • People with Mental Illness: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Welcomed a guest speaker from the Brain Injury Alliance of Oregon. Discussed the memberships of the subcommittee. Co-chair Patrick resigning from PCCEP as of February 24th. New co-chair is PCCEP member Amy. • Portland Police Bureau Updates regarding Recommendations: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ PPB has 60 days to response to PCCEP recommendations. All five of PCCEP recommendations on the PPB Community Engagement Plan were accepted and were cooperated into 2018 report. The PPB Chief and Mayor are currently working on their responses to the most recent submission of PCCEP Recommendations.
<p>DOJ Presentation</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Presentation by the Department of Justice (DOJ) – An overview of the Settlement Agreement on Substantial Compliance. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Summary: As of January 10th, 2020, the DOJ found the City in Substantial Compliance with all components of the Agreement, confirming the Compliance Officer and Community Liaison (COCL) Assessment. Substantial Compliance must be sustained for one year before the US and the City of Portland can then move on to ask the court to dismiss the case. DOJ will continue monitoring the City’s performance for the rest of 2020.
<p>Court Statement</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • PCCEP Court Report for the February 25 Court Hearing • PCCEP Vote <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Motion Amendment (Conclusion to Statement) pass by a vote of 5-1-3 ○ Statement as a whole pass by a vote of 9-1 • The Court Report crafted by PCCEP will be submitted to the court with the Amendment added to the Statement as a conclusion.
