Welcome and Introductions

Tammy Mayer welcomed the group and turned the meeting over to Kim Roark.

ONIBRS Update

Kim Roark discussed the meeting the RegJIN Sustainment Team had with the Oregon State Police on Apr 1 16 regarding continued troubles reporting ONIBRS.

Maj Worthy and Mike Hawkins (OSP) stated 7-8 months ago the state recognized reporting issues with ONIBRS. They stated there was nothing compelling us to report 150+ data points versus the 50+ that NIBRS requires. They went on to say that OSP is standing up a new NIBRS repository that is currently being built and is expected to be ready for testing in late Jun 16. The RegJIN partner agencies have been offered the first usage of that new repository. This will give an apple to apple comparison for everyone when looking at the stats.

Discussion:

- What are the next steps? Kim Roark stated that we are working with Versaterm to outline the plan and who does what. Following the meeting, the Sustainment Team will put together a white paper and send it out to all the RUB members outlining the timeline, cost (if any), scope, and impacts.
- What is the cost to get us transitioned to NIBRS? Tammy Mayer stated we do not expect a cost. Versaterm had a responsibility to get us to ONIBRS compliant which we have not been able to do. Turning us towards NIBRS, which other agencies already us, should be fairly easy.
- Is training required? Maj Worthy stated there will be 2 days of training by CJIS, probably at the WCSO lab.
- Do we have to go back in and revalidate reports? Unknown at this time.

Mike Francis motioned for the vote with Andy Potter seconding it. Wendi Babst voted against, while Roy Rhine, Steve Shea, Mike Whitney, and Nick Weltch abstained. The vote passed.

Minutes Approval

Tammy Mayer asked if there was any discussion on the Mar RUB minutes. Hearing none, Roy Rhine motioned for a vote with Sean Boyle seconding. Wendi Babst and Jenn Reed abstained. The vote passed.

New Table Update

Kim Roark discussed a request to add a T-code for alarms. Nick Weltch motioned for a vote and Tammy seconded. The vote passed unanimously.

Kim Roark discussed Beaverton's request to add a Street Check for K-9 training. Melaney Koch motioned for a vote with Mike Francis seconding. The vote was passed unanimously and the code is in the system as of March 1, 2016.

Other issues

Melaney Koch asked for the form to access the crime analyst server be sent out. Tammy Mayer stated she would get with Ed Arib and ensure it gets out ASAP.
