## Tillamook Neighborhood Greenway Safety Issues

- Safety concerns at 21st and Tillamook crossing. Concerns about vehicles traveling recklessly and at high speeds. Concerns about low visibility at crossing points.
- Concerns about vehicle volumes and speeds on Tillamook between Williams and Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd. Also concerns about vehicle volumes and speeds on the Rodney Neighborhood Greenway.
- Concerns about visibility and safety at the 7th and Tillamook off-set intersection/roundabout.

## General Tillamook Neighborhood Greenway Enhancement Project Feedback

- Concern about on-street parking removal.
- Support for a roundabout at the 26<sup>th</sup> and Tillamook greenway-greenway intersection.
- Desire for enhancements east of 28th on Tillamook Neighborhood Greenway.
- Concern that speed bumps are uncomfortable to bike across.

## Traffic Diversion between Williams and Martin Luther King Blvd. Feedback

- Support for diverting traffic off of the Tillamook Neighborhood Greenway, but concern that diversion options will divert more traffic onto the Rodney Neighborhood Greenway.
- Most support for the semi-diverter at Williams and Tillamook option.
- Concern about vehicle travel impacts.
