As part of the 30% design milestone, the TriMet Division Transit Project team (including staff and technical design consultants) will provide a brief project update. This will be followed by a focused review of bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure at station platforms. The team will share the vetting process and design development work undertaken to date including technical findings and feedback received from the project partners, BAC/PAC and other active transportation/accessibility representatives. The presentation will be an open forum with feedback, with questions and insight from the committees continuing to be an important process in the design development of the project.
