

ORDINANCE No.

*Authorize a contract with the lowest responsible bidder for the Springwater Connector Neighborhood Greenway Fixing Our Streets Paving Project (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. In May 2016, Portland voters approved Measure 26-173, the first local funding source in Portland's history dedicated exclusively to the City's transportation needs.
2. The Springwater Connector Neighborhood Greenway was included in the list of Fixing Our Streets projects, which will add vital links to the City's neighborhood greenway network.
3. The project scope includes crossing improvements near Whitman Elementary School, a new multi-use path in Flavel Park, traffic calming, a new connection to the Springwater Trail, and paving of gravel streets with new sidewalk construction.
4. The project is identified in the City's Capital Improvement Program (CIP).
5. The Bureau of Transportation has funds budgeted in FY 2019/20 for construction, inspection and management of the project.
6. The Bureau's level of confidence in the cost estimate for this project is moderate; project is well defined and plans and specifications are nearing completion.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. Upon the Council's acceptance of the Chief Procurement Officer's report recommending the lowest responsible bidder, the Chief Procurement Office is authorized to negotiate and execute a contract, provided the contract has been approved as to form by the City Attorney's office.
- b. The Auditor to draw and deliver warrants chargeable to T00632 when demand is presented and approved by the proper authority.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because the project must be bid as soon as possible to begin construction in 2019; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.

IMPACT STATEMENT

Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

- Purpose of this legislation is to authorize procurement process for the Springwater Connector Neighborhood Greenway Fixing Our Streets Paving Project and allow the project to be advertised for construction.
- The project scope includes crossing improvements near Whitman Elementary School, a new multi-use path in Flavel Park, traffic calming, a new connection to the Springwater Trail, and paving of gravel streets with new sidewalk construction.

Financial and budgetary impacts:

- The project is funded with \$552,000 in Fixing Our Streets funding with a Transportation Systems Development Charge (TSDC) match of \$671,466.

Community impacts and community involvement:

- A public involvement plan was developed in coordination with Portland Parks and Recreation. To date, property owners and residents living near the project area have been notified using mailers (beginning in early 2018), signage placed along the project alignment with project details and contact information, and door-to-door hand-delivered materials detailing the project. The Brentwood-Darlington and Lents Neighborhood Associations were notified in September 2018 with project information and an offer to present at an upcoming meeting (presentations still outstanding). The project manager also attended a Whitman Elementary School bike and walk to school day to provide project information to parents, students, and school staff. More in-depth outreach and conversations between PBOT project manager and right of way staff continue with property owners requiring temporary construction easements.
