

ORDINANCE NO.

Authorize competitive solicitation and contract for a Source Capture Exhaust System between \$1 million and \$1,500,000 (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. The Department of Homeland Security, through the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) offers the Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) Program. The purpose of the AFG Program is to provide financial assistance to protect the health and safety of the public and firefighting personnel against fire and fire-related hazards.
2. On October 21, 2020, City accepted AFG grant # EMW-2019-FG-04726, Ordinance 190170. The grant provides \$1,167,544 for a Source Capture Exhaust System. The performance period is 9/29/20 to 9/28/21.
3. Portland Fire & Rescue will issue a competitive solicitation for a Source Capture Exhaust System to be installed at 31 fire stations to prevent diesel exhaust emission exposure and limit firefighter occupational exposures to carcinogens.
4. There is a 10% cash match of \$116,754.

NOW, THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Chief Procurement Officer is authorized to conduct a competitive solicitation process in accordance with City Code for the purchase of a Source Capture Exhaust System.
- b. Upon the Council's acceptance of the Chief Procurement Officer's report recommending the contract award, the Chief Procurement Officer is authorized to award, negotiate and execute a contract provided the contract has been approved as to form by the City Attorney's Office.

Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

This Ordinance authorizes a competitive solicitation and subsequent contract to purchase and install a Source Capture Exhaust System in 31 fire stations and the PF&R logistics facility.

- Diesel engine exhaust emissions in fire stations expose firefighters to health risks including certain types of cancers as well as pulmonary and cardiac diseases.
- Source Capture Exhaust Systems meet Occupational Safety & Health Administration (OSHA) and National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) recommendations.

Financial and budgetary impacts:

- \$1,167,544 is funded by AFG grant # EMW-2019-FG-04726.
- A 10% cash match of \$116,754 is provided by existing facility budget.
- The estimated ongoing annual maintenance and repair costs are \$ 400.00 per station; these costs are provided by the existing maintenance budget.

Community impacts and community involvement:

Firefighters have a nine percent higher risk of being diagnosed with cancer and a 14 percent higher risk of dying from cancer than the general U.S. population. The installation of a Source Capture Exhaust System (SCES) will save lives and reduce costs related to medical claims. PF&R stations are open to the public, the installation of SCES will reduce the diesel exhaust exposure risks of community members visiting stations.
