Convene Meeting

Nancy Thorington with BDS convened the meeting and welcomed DRAC Demolition Subcommittee members and guests. All present introduced themselves.

Courtesy Notice of Residential Demolitions

The courtesy notice procedure is now live. When demolition permits are issued, staff provide door hangers to permit holders with recommended instructions on where to hang them. Printable door hangers are also available via the BDS website. There was some discussion about how to track the

efficacy of this program, including tracking if there are fewer complaints and checking with neighborhood coalitions for feedback.

BDS Residential Demolition Website

BDS' demolition delay website went live on July 1, 2014. In addition to links to permit-related documents, it includes information about how to request a code change, with links to the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability.

Draft Program Guide on Major/Minor Residential Remodels/Additions/Alterations and Demolitions BDS staff continues to refine the draft Program Guide that will clarify current practices and reviews, based on the scope of individual projects.

Demolition Delay / Historic Landmarks
