

RCAC Meeting July 24, 2014

### **Introductions**

Mitch introduced himself, and talked about his prior job experiences and interests and his interest in working with the RCAC. David Grant explained the history of Title 28 and the importance the RCAC places on maintaining and updating (as necessary) the title.

### **BDS**

The Bureau is working on a new database that will include moorage information. This should assist with permitting and appeals for floating structures, and help with some of the current bottlenecks with permitting.

### **Proposed Updates to Title 28**

The proposed revisions are still with the code writers, but should get to the Council soon.

Mitch suggested a change to Definition II:

*Moored or Mooring: The attachment of a boat or floating structure in one location temporarily ~~or~~ permanently to piles, walkways, gangways, piers of other structures.*

After some discussion, the committee agreed. Mitch will add this change to the list currently awaiting approval.

### **Multnomah County**

The County is still in favor of approval of Title 28 although it may not be approved until after elections. Stan continues to monitor the progress with Adam Barber.

The update of the Sauvie Island/Multnomah Channel Plan has hit some snags. The proposed draft has been sent back to the citizens' advisory committees. Title 28 could be proposed in the revamp.

### **Dangerous Structures**

The committee discussed the various dangerous structures in the area to bring Mitch up to date with some of the problems within the current floating structure community.
