The Portland Metropolitan Levee System and BDS's role in its future

On the south shore of the Columbia River, in the Portland, Oregon Metro area, lies a 12,000-acre area that relies on a federal flood control system managed by four drainage districts. The area, part of the Columbia Corridor, is critical to the economic future of the region. The risk posed by flooding in the Columbia Corridor alone runs in the hundreds of millions of dollars. This presentation will discuss the history of the drainage districts, how the levees and stormwater management system function, and how development impacts these flood reduction systems.
