FROM CONCEPT TO CONSTRUCTION

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Beginning October 1, 2018

Consistent Expiration and Voiding of Permits (Commercial, Residential, Site Development, Development Review, Major Projects, Zoning, Sign, Plumbing, Electrical, Mechanical, Manufactured Home)

State and City code require that issued permits that have not had a substantive response to a checksheet or an approved inspection within 180 days are deemed abandoned or expire. Code also states that expired permits may be reactivated within 180 days of abandonment or expiration. After 180 days in "Abandoned" or "Expired" status, permits must be voided. A voided permit may not be reactivated except in cases of administrative error or by an approved building code appeal. If not reactivated, a new permit is required in order for the customer to complete and the City to inspect the work.

Currently, the City's permitting program does not *consistently* indicate when permits are abandoned, expired or void between permit types. This creates confusion for customers, the public and staff about the status of a permit, and therefore what has been legally permitted. Beginning October 1, 2018, the City's permitting program will begin showing abandoned expired and void statuses in accordance with state and local codes, and consistently among permit types.

Action Required to Keep A Permit Active

To ease into the change, permits will be changed to the appropriate "Abandoned", "Expired" and "Void" status in phases, with all permits caught up by April 1, 2019.

- **Notice** on BDS Website, Direct e-mail to contractors and trade groups by September 1, 2018.
- Commercial and Residential permit holders and owners will continue to get warning letters prior to and after expiration explaining how to keep the permit active.
- New **online portal** to request extensions and reactivations by October 1, 2018.
- Expanded **program guide** detailing under what conditions permits may be extended or reactivated.
- City code changes for consistency with state code and city policy.
