

The Wastewater Group manages maintenance and repair of Portland's sanitary and stormwater collection systems, and is responsible for collecting and treating sewage from homes and businesses and stormwater runoff from streets. The group monitors, operates and maintains more than 90 sewage pump stations, two wastewater treatment plants, more than 2,000 miles of sewer pipe, and 1,900 stormwater management facilities.
