## SW Terwilliger Boulevard Sewer Project

### Construction Update

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Environmental Services has started construction on project to construct 7,600 feet of eight-inch sewer in Terwilliger Boulevard from SW Northgate Avenue to Highway 43. The new Terwilliger sewer will connect to the 30-inch Tryon Interceptor sewer, which carries sewage to the Tryon Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant in Lake Oswego. This improvement to the wastewater collection system will help protect water quality, public health, and the environment.

#### Developments of Note

- Crews began by paving Glen Road between SW Iron Mountain Road and SW Underhill Road.
- **Crews are scheduled to close SW Terwilliger starting on Monday, December 5.** Traffic delays are expected, please choose an alternate route.
- The first phase of construction will begin on SW Terwilliger, west of the Highway 43 intersection. The work taking place on the highway will be scheduled at a later date.
- Access will be maintained to Tryon Creek State Natural Area and users are considered LOCAL ACCESS.


## What To Expect During Construction

- Work hours will typically be 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. The contractor may schedule work on Saturdays as well.
- Crews will use open trench and horizontal directional drilling to install the new pipe and manholes. Visit [www.portlandoregon.gov/bes/methods](http://www.portlandoregon.gov/bes/methods) to learn more about construction methods and to see pictures.
- Construction creates noise, vibration and dust and disrupts normal neighborhood activity.
- Sewer, water, and other public utilities will remain in service during construction.
- There will be traffic delays during construction hours.
- There may be periods of inactivity between construction phases.
- A city construction inspector will be on-site during work hours. Inspectors typically wear a City of Portland safety vest and a hard hat.

**What We've Heard From You**

Several neighbors have asked about safety measures in the Riverdale-Dunthorpe Neighborhood. LOCAL ACCESS ONLY signs will be posted on most major roads leading into the neighborhood. Speed limits will be lowered nearing the construction zone. Environmental Services has contracted additional police enforcement for the area to uphold driver safety. Traffic engineers from each local government in the project area will be monitoring the traffic control plan.
