Fanno Pressure Sewer Repair Project Construction Update



This project will replace 19 maintenance access structures in nine locations in the Garden Home area, as well as install a pressure monitoring and recording system station off SW Railroad Street. These upgrades will ensure that the Fanno Basin Sewer System will continue to handle all wastewater flows year-round and provide better monitoring of the entire sewer system in the area. It will protect public health and the health of the Fanno Creek Watershed.

Construction Schedule

- Pre-construction activities and survey work along the sewer pipe will continue over the next week.
- The Fanno Creek Trail will be closed between SW 81st and 77th beginning February 22 and will likely reopen by March 16.
- In addition to the trail locations, all access structure sites (see map below) along the Fanno Pressure Sewer will be excavated between February 22 and the end of March.
 - The excavation sites will be covered with steel plates or fenced in for safety while work is completed elsewhere.
 - There will be periods of inactivity at all sites with repeated visits to each site while they work on both pressure lines.
- After the access structures have been replaced and tested, the sites will be back filled and the surface will be restored or paved.
- The entire project is anticipated to be completed in June.

What to Expect During Construction

- Construction creates noise, vibration and dust and disrupts normal neighborhood activity.
- Regular construction hours will be 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. The contractor anticipates working Monday through Thursdays but may schedule work during the same hours on Fridays and Saturdays.
- Due to opening the sewer lines, there may be intermittent odors during construction.
- A City of Portland inspector will be on-site during work hours and may be able to assist you with an immediate need during construction.
- Sewer, water, and other utilities will remain in service during construction.
- Safety is our priority. Please stay clear of all construction activities, and please keep children and pets clear of all construction activities.
