Fanno Pressure Sewer Repair Project Construction Update



This project will replace 19 maintenance access structures in nine locations in the Garden Home area, as well as install a pressure monitoring and recording system station off SW Railroad Street. These upgrades will ensure that the Fanno Basin Sewer System will continue to handle all wastewater flows year-round and provide better monitoring of the entire sewer system in the area. It will protect public health and the health of the Fanno Creek Watershed.

Trail Access Update

Beginning the week of March 6, intermittent trail re-openings and closures will occur on the Fanno Creek Trail between SW 81st and 77th avenues. All dates below are approximate.

- March 7: The trail will reopen temporarily. The two excavated sites on the trail will be covered with steel plates.
- March 21: The trail will close for approximately a week to install the new section of steel pipe in the first sewer line (see map below for detour).
- Week of March 27: Crews will continue to work on the trail, but will try to reopen the trail for through access with a narrower path.
- Week of May 8: The trail will be closed between SW 81st and 77th avenues to replace steel pipe in the second line.
- May 24: Crews will restore the trail.

Construction Schedule Update

Below is a tentative look-ahead schedule of remaining construction activities, some of which are pending permits and access agreements:

- SW 77th Avenue and SW 76th Avenues sites: Crews will cover excavated sites with steel plates within the next couple weeks and return in early May to work on the second line.
- Esther Court: Crews will begin work on the first sewer line next week and return in early May to work on the second line.
- Garden Home Recreation Center: Crews will begin work at this site as soon as the week of March 13, work through early April, and return in early May to work on the second line.
- SW Railroad Street: Crews will begin work at this site as soon as the week of March 20, work through mid-April, and return in early May to work on the second line.
