

This project is replacing 19 maintenance access structures in nine locations in the Garden Home area, as well as installing a pressure monitoring and recording system station off SW Railroad Street. These upgrades will ensure that the Fanno Basin Sewer System will continue to handle all wastewater flows year-round and provide better monitoring of the entire sewer system in the area. It will protect public health and the health of the Fanno Creek Watershed.

Trail Access Update

The Fanno Creek Trail is closed between SW 81st and 77th avenues until April 17 to work on the second pressure line's maintenance access structures. Intermittent trail re-openings will continue on this section while they test the line for a required period of time. The trail will close again at a later date for a shorter period to restore the trail after both lines are complete.
