Hillsdale Sewer Repair Projects Design Has Begun

Environmental Services is designing projects in the Hillsdale and Multnomah neighborhoods of Southwest Portland to repair or replace 30,000 feet, or 5.7 miles, of public sewer pipes that are on average 80 years old and in deteriorating condition. The Hillsdale Sewer Repair Projects will help protect public health, water quality, and the environment by reducing the possibility of sewage releases to homes, businesses, and streets.

Project Area

The project area is divided into three sections, as shown on the map, and will be completed in phases. Project design is currently focused on the South section.

Schedule

Construction in the South section only is anticipated to begin in the summer of 2019 and take up to a year and a half to complete. Design and construction timelines for the Middle and North sections are not yet known. They will be done sometime after the South section.


What's Happening Now?

Over the next few months, crews will be in the neighborhood locating utilities, surveying, inspecting sewer pipes and manholes with closed circuit TV, and drilling to take soil and pavement samples. This information will help engineers decide which locations need repair and what

construction methods are best for each location. These information-gathering activities typically occur over time, rather than all at once. For details, visit www.portlandoregon.gov/bes/precon.

Public and Private Property Access

Most information-gathering activities will occur in the public right-of-way. It's important that property owners understand that part of their land is deemed "public right-of-way" for streets, sidewalks, utilities, and similar public uses. **In the Hillsdale neighborhood, the public right-of-way often extends well into what appears to be private property, including what appears to be private front lawns. Crews will access these areas to inspect and repair public sewers.**


Public Sewer Easements

In addition, where the city has public sewer easements, crews may need to access private property for survey, other activities, and eventual sewer repairs. City outreach staff will coordinate with affected property owners for access to public sewer pipes and manholes.

Hillsdale South Section

Project design is currently focused on the South section, which will include about 9,000 feet, or 1.7 miles, of sewer repairs (see map).

The South section will be followed by the Middle and North sections, although you may see crews in all three project sections throughout the life of the project.



Another large-scale sewer repair project is also being designed in the adjacent South Portland-Burlingame neighborhoods. For more information, visit www.portlandoregon.gov/bes/spb.
