South Portland-Burlingame Sewer Repair Project Design Has Begun

Environmental Services is designing projects in the South Portland and South Burlingame neighborhoods to repair or replace 10,800 feet, or 2 miles, of public sewer pipes that are on average 90 years old and in deteriorating condition. The South Portland-Burlingame Sewer Repair Project will help protect public health, water quality, and the environment by reducing the possibility of sewage releases to homes, businesses, and streets.

Schedule

Construction is anticipated to begin in the summer of 2019 and will be completed in phases. The first phase will take up to a year to complete.

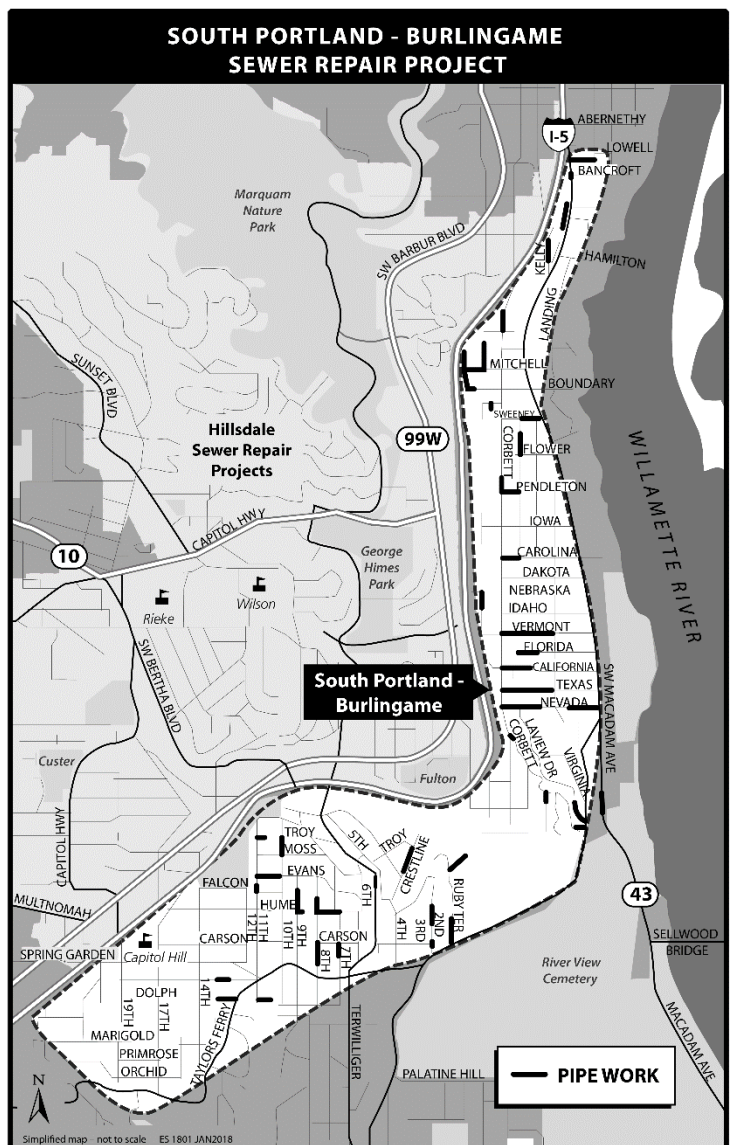
What's Happening Now?

Over the next few months, crews will be in the neighborhood locating utilities, surveying, inspecting sewer pipes and manholes with closed circuit TV, and drilling to take soil and pavement samples. This information will help engineers decide which locations need repair and what construction methods are best for each location.

These information-gathering activities typically occur over time, rather than all at once. For details, visit www.portlandoregon.gov/bes/precon.

Public and Private Property Access

Most information-gathering activities will occur in the public right-of-way. It's important that property owners understand that part of their land is deemed "public right-of-way" for streets, sidewalks, utilities, and similar public uses. **In the South Portland and South Burlingame neighborhoods, the public right-of-way often extends well into what appears to be private property, including what appears to be private front lawns. Crews will be accessing these areas to inspect, maintain, and repair public sewer pipes and manholes.**

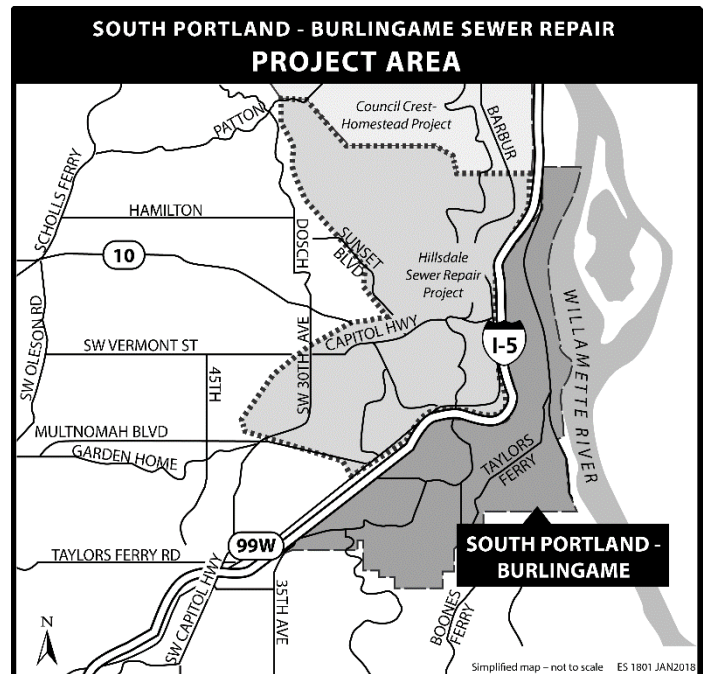
Public Sewer Easements

In addition, where the city has public sewer easements, crews may need to access private property for survey, other information-gathering activities, and eventual sewer repairs. City outreach staff will coordinate with affected property owners for access to public sewer pipes and manholes.

Project Area

This area of Southwest Portland will see several sewer repair and stormwater improvement projects over the next few years. Two other large-scale sewer repair projects adjacent to this South Portland-Burlingame project are the Council Crest-Homestead and Hillsdale projects.
