South Portland-Burlingame Sewer Repair Project Project Divided into Two Phases

Environmental Services is designing projects in the South Portland and South Burlingame neighborhoods to repair or replace 10,800 feet, or 2 miles, of public sewer pipes that are on average 90 years old and deteriorating due to age. The South Portland-Burlingame Sewer Repair Project will help protect public health, water quality, and the environment by reducing the possibility of sewage releases to homes, businesses, and streets.

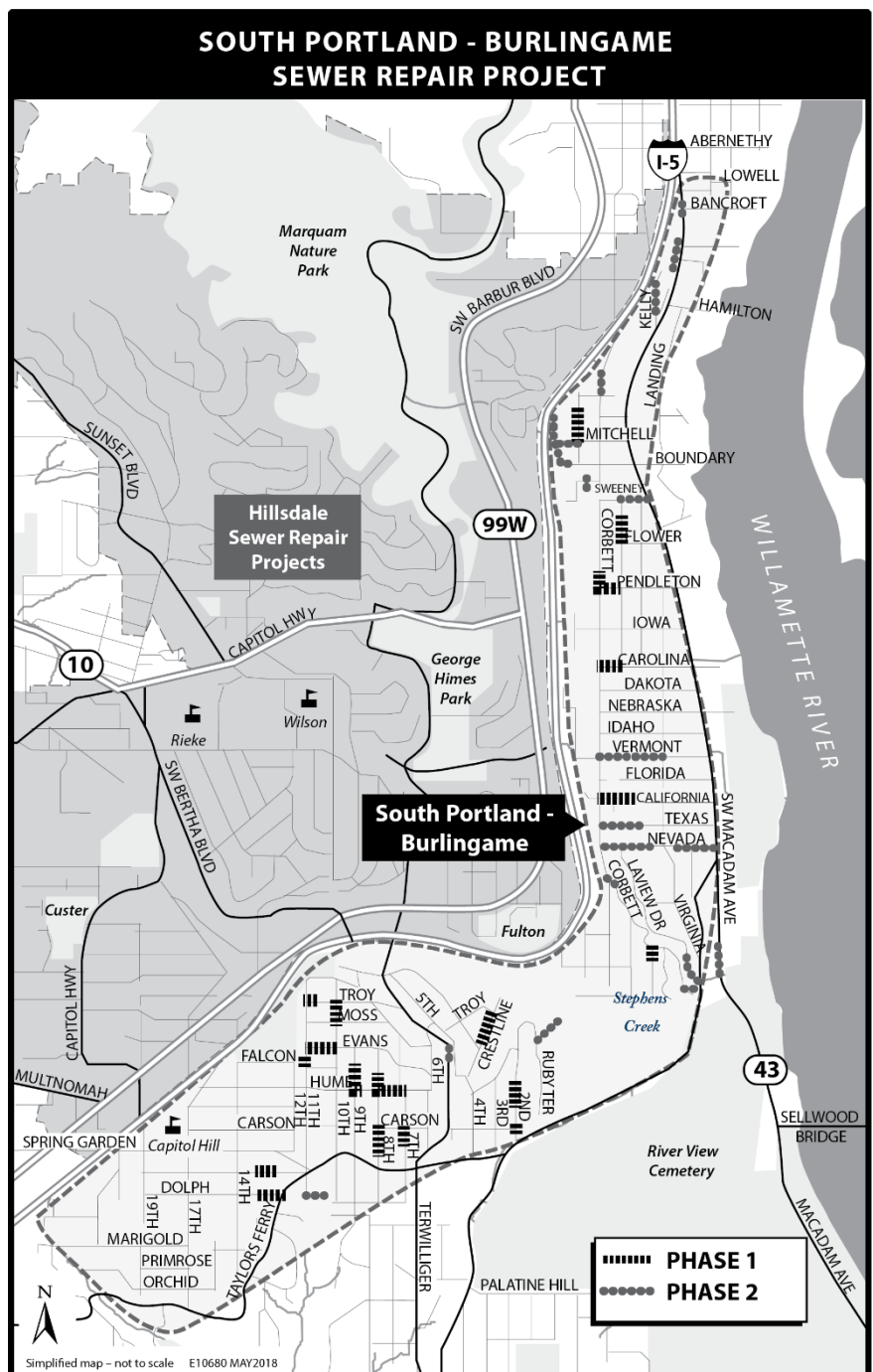
Schedule

Construction of Phase 1 is anticipated to begin in September 2019 and take a year to complete. The construction schedule for Phase 2 is to be determined.

Design Update

Over the last few months, crews have been in the neighborhood surveying, locating utilities, inspecting sewer pipes and manholes, studying soil types and conditions, and collecting information to help engineers decide which locations need repair and what construction methods are best for each location.

You may continue to see crews in the neighborhood conducting these activities, in both Phase 1 and Phase 2 locations (see map).

South Portland-Burlingame Phases

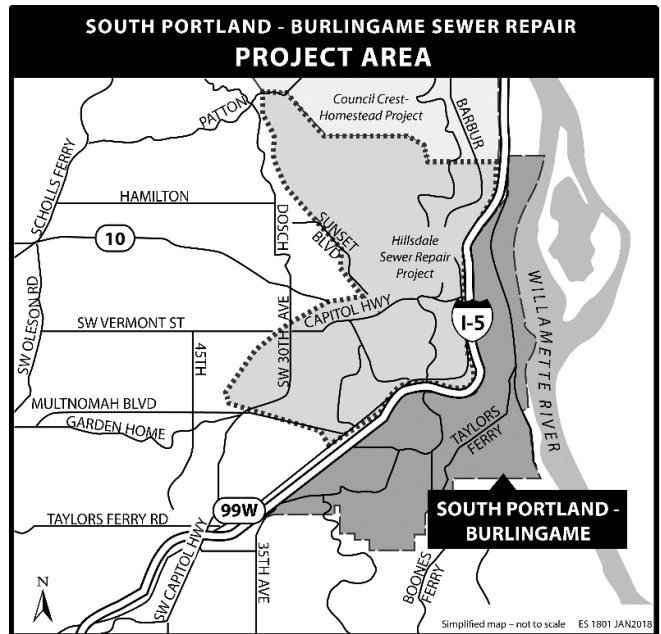
Engineers have determined which pipes they can move forward to construct repairs beginning in the fall of 2019. These pipes are labeled Phase 1 on the project map on the front of this notice. Engineers have determined that several pipes will require more complex engineering and time to plan and make needed repairs. Factors include difficult access to sewer pipes and manholes, challenging geotechnical and topographical conditions, and private property coordination. These pipes are labeled Phase 2 on the project map.

A construction timeline for Phase 2 is not yet known. You may still see crews working in Phase 2 locations as they continue to study these more challenging locations and design plans for future sewer repairs.

While we will keep you informed as Phase 2 develops, our more frequent outreach for South Portland-Burlingame will focus on Phase 1. Within the next few months, for example, we hope to have construction methods identified for each location.

Adjacent Projects
