Hillsdale Sewer Repair Project – South Section Proposed Night Work on Capitol Highway


Environmental Services is designing projects in the Hillsdale and Multnomah neighborhoods of Southwest Portland to repair or replace 30,000 feet, or 5.7 miles, of public sewer pipes that are on average 80 years old and in deteriorating condition. Project design is currently focused on 9,000 feet, or 1.7 miles, in the South section. The Hillsdale Sewer Repair Projects will help protect public health, water quality, and the environment by reducing the possibility of sewage releases to homes, businesses, and streets.

Schedule

Construction in the South section only is anticipated to begin in the summer of 2019 and take up to a year and a half to complete.

Design Update

Over the last few months, crews have been in the neighborhood surveying, locating utilities, inspecting sewer pipes and manholes, studying soil types and conditions, and collecting information to help engineers decide which locations need repair and what construction methods are best for each location. You may still see crews in the neighborhood conducting these activities.



Proposed Night Work

Environmental Services is partnering with the Portland Bureau of Transportation to complete sewer repairs on Capitol Highway as part of their repaving project. Work at each of the three locations (see map) should take less than one week and require one night of work at each of the three sections, with daytime pipe cleaning and sewer bypass setup.

Environmental Services is proposing to work 24/7 for approximately one day and night to line the sewer pipes. The pipe lining process is a minimum 24-hour process and cannot be stopped once started. Nighttime construction on Capitol Highway is expected to occur sometime between August 2018 and February 2019. The specific dates for this day and night work will be determined after a city contractor is hired to do the work.

Over one-third of Portland's 2,500 miles of sewer pipes are more than 80 years old. Projects to replace or repair aging sewers are important for protecting water quality, public health, and the environment. Learn more at www.portlandoregon.gov/bes.

Portland noise code allows construction from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Saturday. Work after 6 p.m. and before 7 a.m. and all hours on Sundays requires a noise variance from the Portland Noise Office. Because construction crews will work past 6 p.m. one day and night to line the pipes and harden the lining, Environmental Services will apply for a noise variance. Equipment that generates noise will include a water jet truck, sewer cleaning truck, air compressor, sewer bypass pumps, generators, front end loader, and crane. Night work will require lights.



Sewer repairs in the Hillsdale area will eventually include the Middle and North sections as shown on the map to the right. Design and construction timelines for those sections are not yet known. They will be done sometime after the South section.
