
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Sunnyside North Green Street and Sewer Project Construction Begins

APRIL 25, 2019

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Environmental Services is beginning construction to repair, replace, or install 7,000 feet of public sewers, build up to 32 green street planters, and remove 2.6 million gallons of stormwater a year from the sewer system. Many of the existing sewer pipes are 100 to 120 years old and deteriorating due to age, or undersized for the sewer and stormwater flows in the area. These improvements will protect public health, property and the environment and reduce the possibility of sewage releases into streets, homes and businesses in the Willamette Watershed.



Construction Schedule

Construction is scheduled to begin the week of May 6 on SE Yamhill between 29th and 30th. Work will start with installing a new sewer line and manholes, then sewer connections to properties. Crews will move to east to install a new line on SE Yamhill between 30th and 31st.

Preconstruction Activities

Beginning next week, April 29, crews will be videotaping the current conditions of sewer pipe pruning trees, and you may see various colored paint marks that locate utilities. For more detailed information regarding preconstruction activities, visit www.portlandoregon.gov/bes/preconstruction.

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Stormwater runoff can impact water quality in rivers and streams. Portland uses green streets, ecoroofs, trees and other green infrastructure to increase sewer system efficiency, and protect water quality, public health, and the environment.

What to Expect During Construction

- **Noise, Vibration and Dust** may disrupt normal neighborhood activity.
- **Traffic Delays** will occur in and near the work area. Please observe traffic control signs and follow the directions of flaggers.
- **Driveway Access** to your property will be maintained, but construction may impact normal use of your driveway or entrance to your business.
- **On-street parking** will be restricted in and near the work zones to create a safe work environment and to stage equipment and materials.
- **Sewer, water, and other utilities** will remain in service during construction.
- **Equipment Storage:** Some equipment and materials may be stored on your street or nearby streets overnight.
- **Schedule Changes and Inactivity:** construction schedule is subject to change due to a variety of factors, including conditions underground, subcontractor schedules, and availability of materials. These same variables may cause periods of inactivity between construction phases.
