

Sunnyside North Green Street and Sewer Project Sewer Construction Continues and Moves

Environmental Services continues construction to repair, replace, or install 7,000 feet of public sewers, build up to 32 green street planters, and remove 2.6 million gallons of stormwater a year from the sewer system. Many of the existing sewer pipes are 100 to 120 years old and deteriorating due to age, or undersized for the sewer and stormwater flows in the area. These improvements will protect public health, property and the environment and reduce the possibility of sewage releases into streets, homes and businesses in the Willamette Watershed.



Developments of Notes

Due to extremely challenging utility locations and ground conditions, crews had to work until 1:00 am Thursday morning. This was much later than anticipated and unavoidable due to the weather in already challenging conditions. To leave the area safe for neighbors, they needed to continue working to fill the trench and compact the ground. The adjacent neighbors were informed, but not the entire area. We apologize for the inconvenience this caused.

Crews will move to SE 27th between Belmont and Yamhill starting July 1 (no work on July 4 and 5), then SE 28th between Belmont and Yamhill the following week when they have completed sewer work on SE 27th. They may not be back to SE 33rd and Yamhill for a couple of weeks while they work out the utility conflicts they encountered this week. Portland Water Bureau continue to work on SE 31st and Yamhill.
