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
Hollywood-Grant Park Phase Two Sewer Repair Project Sewer Repairs Begin Soon

Environmental Services is beginning construction on a sewer repair project in your neighborhood to repair or replace 3,000 feet of aging public sewer pipes that are in deteriorating condition. The Hollywood-Grant Park Phase Two Project includes repair and replacement of manholes, sewer access cleanouts, and sewer service laterals. This project will protect public health and the environment by reducing the possibility of sewage releases to houses and streets.

This project includes pipes that were part of the original Hollywood-Grant Park Sewer Repair Project, which was completed in 2017. Due to the complexity of work in sewer easements on private properties, the Phase Two pipes were removed from that project and added to the Montavilla North Sewer Repair Project contract for construction this summer.



Landis & Landis Construction is the City's contractor for Montavilla North project and the Hollywood-Grant Park Phase Two pipes that are included in that project and shown on the map above.

Schedule

Public sewer repairs will begin the week of July 15. Cured-in-Place-Pipe Lining (CIPP) work is scheduled at the following locations:

- North of NE Schuyler Street, east of NE 35th Avenue – install pipe liner July 18
- North of NE Broadway Street, east of NE 35th Avenue – install pipe liner July 23

Crews will return to these locations at a future date to complete spot repairs.

The schedule may change due to a variety of factors, including weather, conditions underground, availability of materials and labor, and other factors. In general, work hours are from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday through Friday, and Saturdays as needed.

Construction Methods

The contractor will use a combination of trenchless and open trench methods to repair and replace public sewer pipes, manholes, cleanouts, and sewer service laterals. The methods may vary from property to property depending on many factors, including pipe conditions, soil types, slope, access challenges, and other factors.

For CIPP lining repairs, crews will use manholes in the street and in between private properties to insert and inflate the lining. The pipe lining process should take one day at each location. Crews will complete spot repairs using the Open Trench Excavation construction method. Crews will dig a trench to replace isolated segments of the mainline pipe that lining alone cannot adequately repair. Private Property Access

Environmental Services and its contractor will continue to coordinate with property owners to plan and schedule access to private properties and public sewer easements.
