

Project Update

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Hollywood-Grant Park Phase Two Sewer Repair Project Sewer Repairs Scheduled for October 10-11

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Environmental Services will soon begin construction to repair an aging and deteriorating public sewer pipe in a public sewer easement located north of NE Broadway, south of NE Schuyler Street, between NE 35th and NE 36th avenues. The repairs will protect public health and the environment by reducing the possibility of sewage releases to houses, businesses, and streets.


Location

The public sewer pipe to be repaired is located in a public sewer easement between NE Broadway and NE Schuyler Street. See the circled line on the map.

Schedule

Cured-in-Place-Pipe Lining (CIPP) work is scheduled at the circled location shown on the map. Crews will be on-site at 7 a.m. on Thursday, October 10, to set up their work. The pipe lining process will begin two to four hours after setup and will last until midnight or later.

The Portland Noise Office granted Environmental Services a noise variance to enable work both days and nights. Work at the other two locations on the map is currently not scheduled.



Construction Methods

The public sewer pipe to be repaired is several hundred feet long and in shallow ground. Therefore, the pipe lining process to repair it will take a full day, and the curing process to harden the liner inside the pipe will last until midnight or later. The pipe lining process must be done when the pipe is dry and no rainwater is flowing into the pipe. If there is rain, this work will likely be cancelled and rescheduled.

Restricted Water Use

A restricted water use notice has been issued only to properties directly adjacent to the public sewer easement located north of NE Broadway, south of NE Schuyler Street, between NE 35th and NE 36th avenues. Impacted properties have an address on NE Schuyler Street or NE Broadway between NE 35th and NE 36th avenues and should have received a notice called ADVANCE NOTICE OF RESTRICTED WATER USE with a form to fill out and return to Environmental Services.

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Over one-third of Portland's 2,500 miles of sewer pipes are more than 80 years old. Projects to replace or repair aging sewers are important for protecting water quality, public health, and the environment. Learn more at www.portlandoregon.gov/bes.

Due to the shallow position of the pipe to be repaired, a bypass system cannot be set up during the lining process to provide use of private residential sewer and drainage systems that are connected to this pipe. Therefore, Environmental Service is asking all residential properties directly adjacent to this public sewer easement not to flush their toilets or pour water or other liquids down the drain during the lining operation on **Thursday, October 10, beginning at 9 a.m. and through midnight or later.**

If you received the restricted water use notice, **we need to hear back from you by Friday, September 27,** if you would like a porta potty or other accommodation. See the notice we posted at your property. You can also find the notice online at www.portlandoregon.gov/bes/HGP2.

What to Expect during Construction

- Crews will be on-site at 7 a.m. on Thursday, October 10, to set up their work. The pipe lining process will begin two to four hours after setup, and the curing process to harden the liner inside the pipe will last until midnight or later.
- The pipe lining process can only be done when there is no rain, because water flowing into the pipes would ruin the lining. If this work must be cancelled due to rain or other factors, all properties adjacent to the sewer easement will be notified.
- During the pipe lining process, people nearby may smell an odor that is often described as being similar to plastic or glue. The odor is from the chemical styrene, which is in the resin of the liner. While unpleasant for some, the amount of airborne styrene generated by the lining process is not a health risk at the levels observed by the City of Portland and tested and monitored by an independent industrial hygienist. The odor dissipates quickly once the process is complete.
- Equipment that generates noise includes sewer cleaning trucks, compressors, light trucks, generators, pumps, and ventilation fans.
- Vactor trucks will be in the area to operate vacuum pumps necessary to clean the pipes. Vactor trucks generate noise and can be in place for up to several hours at a time.
- Night work will require lighting of the work zone.
- In the event of a sewer backup, immediately call 503-823-1700 to report the problem and the location. The number is staffed all hours and all days, 24/7.
