City of Portland CDL Employee Medication Notice

The City of Portland Commercial Driver's License Drug and Alcohol Policy states:

"Prohibited Conduct: Drugs

2. Using prescription or nonprescription medication before reporting to work or while at work unless a physician has advised the CDL employee that the medication will not adversely affect the employee's ability to operate safely a commercial motor vehicle."

And also provides:

"Medication may present a danger to CDL employees, their co-workers and the public due to the medication's effects on alertness and job performance. CDL employees must report to their immediate supervisors the use of prescription or nonprescription medication that could impair the employees' ability to perform their jobs. CDL employees are responsible to have their physicians determine whether the medication could reasonably impair their ability to perform their jobs."
