



1. Which of the following is your primary mode of travel for commuting to work? For the purpose of this survey please consider "primary" to mean "the mode you use for the longest part of your trip."






3. How many vehicles are owned or leased by the people living in your household?








Resident 1: Do you have a transit pass (annual or monthly)?








10.If you do not have an off-street residential parking space available at your residence, where do you park your vehicle(s)?


12. Where do you park your bicycle(s)?

- A few responders park their bikes outside in the provided bike parking at their building


13. How would you describe the available bicycle parking at your residence? (Check all that apply)


14. How do you pay for your off-street residential parking space(s)?


15. What is the farthest you have had to park from your residence or destination?




19. What time of day is on-street parking the hardest to find?


20. Is parking generally more difficult to find on the weekends than the weekdays? Yes No


21. In the past week, how many times did you drive (one time equals a round trip out and back to your residence)?



Common responses:


- Theft and damage to car parked on the street


How many people, including yourself, are in your household? (Responses)




How many bedrooms are in your unit?



What is your monthly rent or mortgage payment?






