

Holiday Recycling Help for Our Community

Visit www.oregonmetro.gov/findarecycler to learn what can be reused and recycled



- Find a drop-off yard debris recycling center or nearby tree collection event.



- Save foam packing peanuts to use again or check with packaging stores who may reuse them; otherwise they go in the garbage.



- If you can't reuse your tinsel strands ("icicles"), these go in the garbage.



- Only plastic bottles and tubs go into your community's recycling. Ask Metro if other plastic packaging and bags can be recycled at a drop off; otherwise, it's trash.



- You can save gift wrap for use next year, or it can go in your home recycling if it isn't foil or plasticized.



- String lights are recycled for the copper in the wires - you can drop them off at a recycling depot or Metro's transfer stations — free of charge.



- Tissue paper can be reused; otherwise it's recyclable.



- Reuse bows and ribbons; otherwise they go in the garbage.

- Electronics (televisions, computers, monitors and other items) don't go in the trash or the recycling. If they are still in good working order, look for donation options.
